### **SUS UR Activities**

As we implement the various changes with Documentation Redesign, we will also be revising our UR activities. Below is a summary, but we realize a great deal of this is new, so please reach out to your UR and Contract Manager liaisons with any questions that arise:

<u>UR Reviews</u>: This month we concluded our UR reviews for FY 2021-22 and so reviews for FY 2022-23 files will incorporate the new requirements under CalAIM. In August, the UR team will perform a "UR

Light" for July services to get a pulse on implementation and provide/identify any technical assistance needs. They will also do some periodic reviews and offer continued technical assistance in September. In October, we will begin implementing quarterly (rather than monthly) UR reviews and review a sample of files. The UR Specialists will coordinate with you directly on scheduling.

<u>Chart Review Template</u>: The UR team is developing an updated UR template. We will share the tool with you once it is completed in case you would like to use it for your regular internal URs.

<u>Documentation Manuals and Documentation Training</u>: Please remember that CalMHSA has completed all of the <u>DMC-ODS Documentation Manuals</u> and all DMC-ODS staff are required to participate in Documentation training. # **Medi-Cal Asset Changes**

On June 29, 2022, the Department of Health Care Services received federal approval of California's two-phased approach to increase, and eventually eliminate, asset limits for certain Non-Modified Adjusted Gross Income (Non-MAGI) Medi-Cal populations through the CalAIM Section 1115 Demonstration waiver amendment. The changes will affect the Non-MAGI Medi-Cal beneficiary population who have historically been limited in the amount of property they can own and retain, and still be eligible for Medi-Cal.

Effective July 1, 2022, asset limits will be increased to \$130,000 per person and \$65,000 for each additional household member. The prior asset limits were \$2,000 per person and \$3,000 for two people. Beneficiaries will be able to keep additional resources, resulting in increased financial stability and improved quality of life. This increase in asset limits will make Medi-Cal coverage accessible to a larger number of potentially vulnerable Californians, including elderly and disabled individuals. The eventual elimination of the asset limit, to be implemented no sooner than January 1, 2024, will significantly improve access to Medi-Cal coverage.
